

## Gastroenterology General Referral Guidelines

Austin Health Specialist Clinic holds multidisciplinary sessions to discuss and plan the treatment of patients with Gastroenterology conditions.

Department of Health clinical urgency categories for specialist clinics

**Urgent:** A referral is urgent if the patient has a condition that has major functional impairment and/or moderate risk of permanent damage to an

organ/bone/tissue/system if not seen within 30 days. For emergency cases, please send the patient to the Emergency department.

**Semi Urgent:** Referrals should be categories as Semi Urgent that has the potential to deteriorate within 30-90 days.

**Routine:** The Gastroenterology Consultant will triage Referrals. Appointments will be booked accordingly.

## Exclusions: The following conditions should <u>not</u> be referred to outpatients, but rather patients should be advised to present directly to Emergency Dept:

'Active haematemesis and/or melaena; Acute severe colitis; Jaundice with fever / abdominal pain, Food bolus obstruction, Suspected bowel obstruction Decompensated cirrhosis with encephalopathy, jaundice or sepsis; Clinically significant ascites/hepatic hydrothorax'.

Hepatitis C Diagnosis	All patients with chronic Hep C (positive PCR or viral load) should be considered for treatment with DAAs. When to refer: We are happy to manage all patients with chronic Hepatitis C. Specifically, if suspected cirrhosis, if multiple comorbidities, or renal impairment. If treatment cannot be prescribed by GP	Clinical history and examination Hep C Genotype Hep C Viral load UEC, LFT inc AST, FBE, Hep B sAg, Hep B cAb	Hepatitis C referrals will be fast tracked to an appropriate Austin or Outreach Clinic. Your patient should receive an appointment within 30 days.	As required
